## Koorero a te Tumuaki Haere tonu The Principal speaks continued:

... The process of electing a new Student Representative on the Board is well underway. The Student Representative on the Board must be in Year 9-13 and will attend each monthly Board meeting, representing the student body, and will be paid for this meeting. The Student Representative will write a report for each monthly meeting and/or give a verbal report to the Board at the meeting and will be a voice for all students in the school.

The Student Representative must be someone trustworthy, reliable and able to be confidential. The Student Representative may be required to attend school events as part of their role. Jessika Roberts is the current Student Representative so you can have a chat to her if you want to know more about the role. Nominations for this are due on Saturday 2 September by 12pm. Voting for this will take place on Monday 18 September, 2023 for Year 9-13 students during Whaanau Class time. Results will be declared on Sunday 24 September.

Earlier this term we had a lockdown drill and this went very well. We appreciate your support in this, as parents/caregivers. We work alongside an independent company, Harrison Tew®, who specialises in emergency management planning for schools, whose procedures have been successfully implemented in hundreds of schools throughout New Zealand.

In the case of a genuine incident, should you become aware of a lockdown or evacuation at the school, can I ask that you please DO NOT attend the school or phone the school, as we will not be able to respond. Your presence or your contact may make it more difficult for us or the emergency services to manage a situation.



Staff at Tuakau College recently completed a very successful Staff Only Day on the topic of Cultural Sustainability. We were privileged to have George Ihimaera as our guest presenter. George works for MAC (Maori Achievement Collaborative) and delivered a korero to our staff around the Tiriti o Waitangi through his own personal experiences and whaanau. Following this our staff split into groups and rotated around different workshops relating to cultural sustainability. It was a great day that our staff enjoyed!

We have had to make a change to the date for Senior Prizegiving for this year. 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## Mock Exams 2023 Whakamātautau Tawai 2023

**Mock exams are coming up quickly in Week 9 (Monday 11 - Friday 15 September, 2023).** During Mock Exams normal bell times will apply for the rest of the kura and senior classes will continue as normal. Students will only come out of class for their exams.

Students need to check their exam timetable carefully and report to the exam venue 15 minutes prior to the start of the exam. It is important that students attend classes as normal, except when sitting exams. Rolls will be marked. There is no eating permitted in the exam venue and only a clear drink bottle may be taken in.

Students are to bring pens/pencils in a clear plastic bag. No twink allowed. Students are not permitted to wear a watch of any sort. There will be clocks in the room and the supervisors will update students during the exam on the time using the whiteboard. Approved Calculators only. All bags and personal items must be left at the front of the exam room.

Any student who misses an exam will require a medical certificate to be given to their Dean on the day they return to school.

In regards to leaving exams; no student may leave in the last half hour of the exam.

- For a 1 hour paper, students must stay for the whole hour
- For a 2 hour paper, students must stay for 1 hour
- For a 3 hour paper, student must stay for 2 hours

Bus students must organise transport home on days they have an exam that finishes at 4pm.

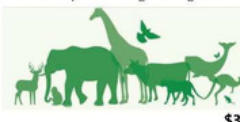
