2022 will be put down as the end of two memorable years, not just at Tuakau College, but throughout the 'motu' and around the world because it is the year that COVID-19 restrictions were lifted. Over the last two years we have experienced COVID-19 devastating the routines we had in place. This pandemic has impacted New Zealand society and changed our lives. It has changed how we interact with each other and how we view the world.

Now that the restrictions have disappeared there seems to be a 'COVID-chaos' in the world. The world has become more chaotic as it tries to teeter back to some kind of normality. It has affected:

- World peace with Russia invading the Ukraine and China making noises to repatriate Taiwan.
- It has allowed extreme viewpoints to be accepted. Hate speech, misinformation, fake news is believed and prominent and the rights of people being eroded (for example in the USA Women's rights have disappeared in some US States around their body their decision)
- Unstable governments in many places a new Prime Minister in the UK again!
- Economies suffering, people feeling the pinch due to escalating oil prices, the cost of food and spiraling inflation
- Tourism is multiplying exponentially as people travel the world again
- Work/life balance is invisible as businesses try hard to re-establish themselves and people work 24/7 to make ends meet
- The job market reallocation of resources where have all the waiters, dishwashers, hospitality people, apple pickers gone too?
- People having the right to complaint about every little thing

This is just the tip of the iceberg on how CVOID-19 has impacted us. In Biology Charles Darwin said "the environment has a critical role in naturally selecting the fittest to best exploit the environment it lives in." COVID-19 has now created an environment that we have to live in, and as a school we have to adapt to the changes to fit the new environment otherwise we fail.

New teaching and learning techniques were foist upon us in an accelerated implementation under COVID-19. We introduced and expanded flipped classrooms, online learning, use of Google classroom and other learning platforms, ZOOM meetings and lessons and a re-evaluation of what we were teaching and what the students were learning to meet the standards.

The two years of COVID-19 has exaggerated the issues with some of our students in terms of their mental health. Across the country students have developed low resilience, they have become needier and less independent, they have less drive and tolerance and they are more distracted and require instant gratification.

It is now our role as educators and your role as parents to develop strategies to bring back the resilience, independence and drive in our students. To do this is going to take time and we need to do this together.

Albert Einstein said "if you keep on doing the same thing, you will get the same thing." Change is a continuous process, not an event, and any school which fails to deliver better ways of education to its students will not allow the students to adapt to the changes externally and the students will not survive in the new modern world.

Nelson Mandela said "education is the most powerful weapon which we can use to change the world." So; the simple advice is we have to embrace change and make it work for our students because they are the ones that are going to change the world.

A major impact of COVID-19 on our students has been the increased amount of time they are now spending on devices, such as their mobile phones. Over the last two years we have definitely encouraged them to engage and spend more time on devices. They had no choice because they had to be able to learn from home.

The fallout is our students are more hooked on devices than ever.

What goes 'hand in hand' with increased screen time is the increased misuse of the devices. We have experienced a huge increase in the misuse of mobile phones over the last two years. We have experienced things such as:

- more online bullying (which is blatant and nasty)
- more disruption to learning, as students are distracted by their phone in and out of class
- more teacher abuse because students believe it is 'their right' to have and use their phone at any time of the day and when confronted with this they become disobedient and eventually verbally abuse the staff.
- students are viewing pornographic photos as well as creating nude photos of themselves and sharing it with friends who share it on
- students saying things to others that they would never say to them face-to-face, encouraging others to misbehave and inciting violence
- students are taking unsolicited photos/videos of other students and staff who do not want their photo taken and publishing these without permission (such as photos of others in toilet blocks, PE changing rooms, etc)

Some students have lost their sense of morality and common sense. Most of the time the school is asked to fix the problem even though much of this occurs out of school hours. We are spending a disproportionate amount of time unravelling these situations, but as a school we do not own the problem. To all our parents - the problem belongs to you as a parent/caregiver! Do you know what your student is doing on their phone?

Before mobile phones, students could get away from the hustle and bustle of school and the bullies. Their bedroom at home was a safe haven to hide in. Today their bedrooms have become de-privatised because they take all these issues with them to their rooms through their phones and or other devices. They do not get a break from it. This is a contributing factor in a student's low resilience and the many mental health issues we deal with and facing on a daily basis.

As parents, what can you do? Firstly - who owns the phone? Who is paying for the data? Your child's safety from the 'darknet' is paramount and we have to take action. Here are some suggestions:

- turn the WiFi off at home.
- if they misuse their phone take it off them
- limit the use of their phone during the day and night. Do not allow them to take their phone to their room
- review what they put on their Facebook and Instagram pages parental locks and notifications will assist.
- do you know who their friends are of these Apps?
- support them if they are a victim of the abuse. Get the student to not engage with the students causing the issue. Do not respond to the abuser as you may escalate the issue
- get then to turn their phone off or defriend or remove the app
- o to the Netsafe website to gain further knowledge as to what you can do Report issues to the Police, instead of the school.

After consultation, the Board has decided that from February 2023 student mobile phone use at school between the hours of 9:00am to 3:30pm will be banned. Students do not need to have their phones at school because any internet use will be provided through school devices and any emergency the student has will be dealt with through the school. Mobile phones/ear pods/earbuds will not be allowed. We have done this to improve a number of things:

- to increase the face-to-face interactions with our students.
- reduce and prevent the taking of unsolicited photos/videos/etc at school
- more time will be spent on educating the students instead of dealing with the issues of mobile phones misuse
- improve relationships between students and students and students and staff
- allows for a decreased time in front of a screen. Although we will be using laptops and Chromebooks but at least at interval and lunchtime the students will not have their faces in a phone or screen.
- it will reduce the raru raru (issues) between staff and students.

This is going to be a major change for the staff and students but many schools are heading down this road. When you take away the drug from the drug addict there will be withdrawal period. We will expect this and will be ready for it. We have researched the impact of banning phones and found that similar schools to ours like Waiuku College and Te Puke High have banned them and they have found a huge positive impact on the climate of the school.

Another significant change for the College in 2023 is the timetable and delivery of the curriculum. We are changing to a 6x6 timetable - 6 periods a day over 6 days. This will support the students so that they are not missing the same periods when they are on trades, with an itinerant music teacher, studying through video conferencing (VC), when public holidays are on a Monday and/or Friday, etc.

The only difficulty, we will find, is that students and staff have to remember what day it is. A comprehensive explanation of this concept has been published in the last two e-Bulletin's of 2022.

The third significant change to Tuakau College, apart from the houses going up down Elizabeth Street in the Booker Estate, is the size of our roll! Over the next three years the roll is going to increase dramatically. We are expecting to have close to 900 students next year. But in 2024 there is a huge cohort of Year 7 students, which will push us to over 1000 students!

I can assure the school community that we are planning for this increase so that resourcing does not become a limiting factor. We are in discussions with the Ministry of Education in regards to new classrooms to be built. Unfortunately, these classrooms are usually built after the students arrive so it means our teaching spaces will become 'hot property.' The other factor which we are keeping abreast of is attracting great staff to join the College. There is a teacher shortage and we have been very lucky to secure great staff who want to move into the area.

The last issue is the increase in vaping by students. Vaping is the new scourge on our young people. It is easier to get vapes than cigarettes nowadays. The health implications are unknown but we know that vapes contain nicotine which is a poison and is highly addictive. Students would never light up a cigarette in class but this year we have had a number of students vaping in class. We have taken a strong stance on this. We need your support as a school community to deal with the issue and head towards reducing vaping in and out of school.

Finally; did you know that the College is 48 ³/₄ years old? Tuakau College was opened in 1974 to educate the rangatahi of Tuakau and surrounding districts. We intend to celebrate the Golden Jubilee (50 years opened) in 2024. It is time to now communicate to the school community this event. A reunion Facebook group has been created and can be found on the Tuakau College Facebook page, under 'Groups.' We encourage all ex-students, staff and teachers to join this group. Let's celebrate our Golden Jubilee in style!

Thank you to the Board, the community and the Senior leadership team for their continued support of me as Principal. Also, thank you for supporting all the staff and ensuring our focus remains on our precious taonga - our students, their whanau and their future.

I want to thank the teachers, teaching assistants, relief teachers, teacher support, admin staff and the cleaning and grounds staff - all who have a role to play in making our school function and to make it the very best in all things. Your efforts never go unnoticed and from the school community I want to thank you for your efforts, especially through the COVID-19 era - you all do a fabulous job!

Over the year we have had some staff leave us and staff join us. To the staff leaving: thank you for your commitment to our school and we wish you the best for the future.

- Mr Prakash (Health and Physical Education Teacher) has resigned as he moves into a new home in Auckland with his family. We will welcome Miss A Blackwood to the school as his replacement.
- Mr Courtney (Year 7&8 Teacher) has resigned and is moving to Australia. We will welcome Mrs K Hume as a new Year 7&8 Teacher!
- Mr Kippen (Head of Technology) has resigned and Mrs C Stilwell (who many of you will remember from previous years) will be the Acting Head of Technology for Term 1, 2023 until a new Head of Technology is appointed.
- We will welcome back Mr K Medabala as an English Teacher, while Mr M Williams is on paternity leave,
- We will welcome back Mr A Palmer as a Social Sciences/Business Studies Teacher, while Mrs A Colmer is on Maternity Leave.
- We will welcome Mrs P Chahar as a new Science Teacher.
- We will welcome Mr Collins as a Music Teacher/Itinerant Teacher.
- We will welcome Ms P Toto as a new Te Reo Maaori Teacher.

I can assure the school community that as a school we are adapting to the pressures of today's society and that we are ensuring the achievement rates remain high and that your son or daughter will become an A1 citizen in an everchanging NZ society.




SWIMMING SPORTS 2022





Tuakau College is now a 'Garden to Table' school. This programme has four pou to provide students an opportunity to grow, harvest, prepare and share. A Year 7 class (70) pioneered the programme this year and based on the success of this rollout, the programme may be extended to all Year 7 and 8 students in 2023!

We have chosen to be part of this programme to instill a passion for gardening and cooking from a young age. 'Garden to Table' believe that children are changemakers and their kaupapa is to empower rangatahi to grow, harvest, prepare and share great food. The four pou will allow students to:

- To grow: connecting to Papatūānuku, understanding how our earth can produce nourishing seasonal kai
- To harvest: practicing food security for now and the future
- To prepare: reducing food waste and creating tangible connections between the earth and our kai
- To share: finding creative ways to use produce and enabling korero around where kai comes from

How does 'Garden to Table' work? A 90 minute weekly session, half the class in the kitchen and half in the garden, linked with school curriculum. The children will do everything themselves in the garden and kitchen.

This will include sowing seeds and feeding soil, planting and composting, watering, using reallife tools, measuring and weighing, working as a team, sharing and enriching school connections.



In May our 7O class completed their first cycle of 'Garden to Table.' They harvested their first crop of kale, cooked it and shared the kai. The seedlings were watered regularly and beds maintained. Prior to harvesting the class researched a range of recipes and then made up their own. Harvesting was filled with excitement and participation and cooking their own recipe was a lot of fun! The students worked together to prepare their meal and set the tables and then sat around the table and shared the food they produced from their own garden. The students are looking forward to growing a variety of vegetables in the future!



MAU RAAKAU WAANANGA 2022

During the month of May, a group of 22 boys from Year 9 and Year 10 Reo Rua had the opportunity to learn the whakapapa and tikanga of Mau Raakau. Matua Taane Te Koi, of Uekaha Consultants, and pouako Jalani Te Koi and Kimiora Te Koi facilitated the three day waananga which was held at Te Awamaarahi Marae.

A huge mihi to our tutors for their maatauranga and humility shown in their work with the boys. They were amazing. The boys engaged in the learning and did the mahi at a pretty accelerated pace. They persevered through the physical demands of mau raakau and had to be attentive and focused in waananga situations.

There were so many highlights, but a few included learning the many different movements of mau raakau and haka, visiting and understanding the deep significance of Waikato pakanga (battle) sights from Pookino to Rangiriri and finally, performing aspects of what they learned in front of their whaanau and peers.

We hope that the boys will continue to practice and develop their skills. Huge thanks to parents/caregivers, Te Awamaarahi Marae and our kaiako for the support of this kaupapa. Ākina Hō!





It was great to have this house competition again after COVID-19 meant we couldn't have it last year!









A special thank you to Rawhiti-Whenua Ngataki, an ex student, who was our guest speaker and gave our students some great advice!






























