A friendly reminder about vehicles in and around our kura. Our students safety is important and we ask you to please ensure that you are using your vehicle in a safe manner in and around them and our school. There are a large influx of vehicles using both the Elizabeth Street and Buckland Road entrances to the school for pick ups and drop offs each day. Please keep your speed to the speed limit of 40km/hr and as you enter the Elizabeth Street entrance and please be aware of traffic exiting the school.

Where the Council has marked broken yellow lines (no stopping lines) near the edge of the road, that means vehicles are not to park there, as per the New Zealand Transport Agency rules. Vehicles are also not to park in front, or closer than 1 metre to a vehicle entrance, as per the New Zealand Transport Agency rules. You can be fined and/or have your vehicle towed away if you park in these places. We ask that our wider school community please be respectful of these road rules, each other and residents that live around/near the school. A reminder to all students that they need to be respectful of other people's properties. This means not trespassing or taking shortcuts as they go home. New housing areas are out of bounds and students should not be trespassing or entering construction sites.

We hope you've all saved the date of your child/children's prizegiving next term and we can't wait to celebrate their successes with you! The Senior Prizegiving will be held on the evening of Wednesday 29 October. Our Sports Awards will be held on the evening of Wednesday 15 October. Te Reo Maaori Language Week 2025 Te Wiki o Te Reo Magori 2025



From 15 - 19 September we celebrate the 50th anniversary of Te Wiki o te Reo Maaori! Born of activism, the week grew from a single 'Maaori Language Day' set up in 1972. The seeds of a full week dedicated to te reo Maaori were planted in 1974. By 1975 Te Wiki had found its footing and was off! Its growth and gains are what we celebrate 50 years on. Kia kaha taatou ki te koorero Maaori!

Our Mahi Toi Mane winner was Maxwell from 80. Winners for our Paatai o te Raa came from the teina of our kura; Almani, Mauriora and Pippa. Paatai: Ko wai te Kuini Maaori? Whakautu tika: Ko Te Arikinui Kuini Nga wai hono i te po te kuini Maaori. Our Tuesday question was 'He aha te kupu Maaori o te moko kanohi moo ngaa waahine?" Recently our Equestrian team had an awesome week in Taupo at the 2025 North Island Secondary Schools Equestrian Championships! The secondary school team consisting of Sarah Martin (Year 11), Ellie Entwisle (Year 10), Charli Sabine (Year 10) and Pippa Thomas (Year 9) finished a very credible 13th out of 79 teams! Sammy Kull (Year 7) rode as an individual competitor. Held at the National Equestrian Centre in Taupo, there were 486 competitors taking part in this competition! The week was a true testament to the hard work, grit, and dedication these students have shown all winter!

Sammy Kull (who competed individually due to being too young to compete as part of the team) placed in 4 out of 5 of her classes, coming 3rd in her Show Hunter class, 3rd and then 5th in her two Show Jumping classes and 5th in her Dressage!

Pippa Thomas had top performances across multiple disciplines: Individual Results - Top 10 in every discipline, 1st in Pony Accumulator, 2nd in CTR (Competitive Trail Riding), 6th in Arena Eventing, 8th in Eventing, 10th in Dressage and 10th in Show Hunter. To achieve these results at her first attempt in the team event is awesome! Charli Sabine placed 4th in Level 1 Horse Dressage, 4th in 95cm Horse Arena Eventing, 5th in 1m Horse Show Jumping and 5th in 1m Horse Show Hunter! 






















AIMS Games 2025 AIMS Games 2025


