School Nurse

Role Summary

The School Nurse forms an essential part of the Guidance/Health team, providing health care for the students, staff and visitors of Tuakau College. School based registered nurses utilise nursing knowledge and complex nursing judgement to assess health needs and provide care, and to advise and support people to manage their health. They practise independently and in collaboration with other health professionals, perform general nursing functions to the students of Tuakau College as well assist staff and others if required. We belong to Te Whatu Ora Nurses in Schools programme and the nurse liaises and works closely with Te Whatu Ora to provide health services to the College.

Primary Objectives

To meet the needs of students and staff using contemporary nursing care which is safe, appropriate and effective. The care is based on comprehensive assessment, ensures continuity, and is patient/consumer centred, culturally sensitive and responsive and evidence-based. This will be achieved by the provision of on-site health services and will incorporate:

- The provision of health services to all students and staff within nursing scope of practice
- Complete a “Heads-Up” assessment on all the Year 9 student cohort and new students entering the College
- Complete performance reports termly and liaise with Te Whatu Ora liaison person regularly
- Referral to health and social agencies for appropriate health and social interventions.
- Liaise with other health professionals and Te Whatu Ora initiatives, as well as support immunisation programmes run through the school
- Supporting the delivery of health services to students by other health professionals.
- Supporting students to take responsibility for their own health care and to promoting the appropriate use of health services

Experience and Knowledge

- Registered nurse with current practising certificate and First Aid certificate
- Carry out health assessments on students as directed
- Experience in, or postgraduate study of related areas – accident and emergency, primary health care, child and/or adolescent health.
- Evidence of level of clinical skills, competency and leadership as documented in a professional portfolio.
- Has a desire or shows evidence of an ability to work effectively as a member of a multi-disciplinary team.

- Demonstrates the ability to advance the delivery of reliable and relevant professional school health services to promote optimal health and learning outcomes of students.

- Displays drive and energy and persists in overcoming obstacles
- Reliable, trustworthy and efficient
- Is computer literate, with excellent written and communication skills

- Actively listens, drawing out information and checking understanding
- Empathises with others and considers their needs and feeling

<p>Te Whatu Ora requirements</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete a ‘Heads Up’ assessment on all new students entering the College. • Liaise with the Guidance network around students at risk. • Keep confidentiality at all times with regard to ‘Heads-Up’ assessment and inform Principal or Assistant Principal if student is to be ‘harmed’ – disclosure. • Liaise with Te Whatu Ora liaison person at all times ensuring requirements are being met. • Ensure ‘Performance Reports’ are completed and appropriate documents are sent with these reports. • Be proactive in terms of what ‘work on’s’ come out of the reporting. • Liaise with Guidance team at Tuakau College to make positive changes to ensure we continue to provide good health for the students. • Run the National Rheumatic Fever Programme (NRFP).
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Educate students and staff regarding health issues, life choices, skills and self-responsibility. • Be able to direct student and staff to relevant health education information.

<p>Provision of Appropriate Primary Health Care</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide appropriate emergency first aid to students and staff with suitable referrals and follow up. • Where professional judgement indicates that a student should return home, caregivers (as indicated in KAMAR) will be contacted to arrange for pick up and the student will remain in the Health Centre until caregivers arrive. • Where professional judgement indicates that a student should go to the Medical Centre the nurse will, or delegate another staff member to, take the student to the local Health Centre. • Where professional judgement indicates that an ambulance is required the nurse will liaise with Senior Leadership Team and call for emergency services. • Ensure that the centre is appropriately stocked with first aid materials and equipment. Maintain First Aid kits for school trips and those areas that are high risk in the school. Keep emergency equipment up to date (eg. oxygen, epi pens). • Label and appropriately store students' medication that is documented and accepted by the school for administering to the student while they are at school. • Ensure that the Health Centre is clean and tidy – including beds, equipment, etc. • Ensure that there is an appropriate number of first aiders on staff at school and for school trips and activities.
<p>In School Consultation and Networking</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be an active member of the health and wellbeing team, providing input and referral where appropriate. • Ensure other staff members are aware of relevant health issues of students, by red flagging these students in KAMAR and keeping the health notes up to date. • Keep the KAMAR attendance record, of students who have been in the Health Centre for a whole period or more, up to date. • Communicate with Heads of Houses, Senior Leadership Team and other relevant staff in instances where information regarding discipline issues is disclosed by students. • In all cases of suspected sexual, physical or emotional abuse, refer details to health and wellbeing team immediately. • Distribute appropriate information to staff and students in support of community and national initiatives in the event of a health crisis. • Be available to support school health education programmes as required. • Be accountable for daily organisation and meet with the Guidance team and the Assistant Principal in charge of the Health Centre weekly • Establish and maintain contact between families, school and caregivers. • Where necessary, educate families regarding the importance of taking responsibility for their children's health requirements. • Provide services and resources that are culturally sensitive and respectful of family values and diversity.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make appropriate referrals to the health and wellbeing team and health and social services. • Provide an emergency booklet to the staff or inform staff of students with conditions that require treatment unexpectedly for example epilepsy, diabetics, allergies etc. This should be done regularly and all the teachers of these students should know the plan if an event occurs. • Co-ordinate and lead the Student Health Council and run events like SADD and other Health awareness programmes with the Health Council. • Liaise and work with the Executive manager re: Health and safety requirements.
<p>Professional Liaison</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Establish and maintain contact any contacts between school and other health professionals. • Form positive and a strong working relationship with the Tuakau Medical Centre. • Assist these health professionals as necessary and make appropriate referrals. • Organise staff influenza vaccinations on an annual basis. • Assist with the organisation of the Immunization programmes.
<p>Administration</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maintain adequate computerised daily student contact and treatment records and ensure that these are kept up to date. • Follow any Health and Safety requirements and complete accident register/incident forms for any accidents or serious harm that occurs in school. • Provide the Principal with Health and Safety statistics and details for reporting to Board of Trustees on a monthly basis or when requested. • Ensure personal records and other sensitive materials are securely stored. • Check all new student enrolments in order to identify health needs, red flag students whose health needs should be known by staff, discuss with parents any additional information which is needed for the student's wellbeing while at school. • Communicate with staff regarding any additional health issues as relevant. • Complete a regular stocktake of all items in the Health Centre. • Ensure all appropriate drugs and other items are securely stored • Follow Health and Safety requirements and complete an accident register. • Report to Executive manager monthly on injuries and near misses which is reported to the Board. • Record and referrals by teachers for assessments of students that are involved in physical assaults. These must be reported to the Executive manager with the Health and safety report.

Professional Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Maintain and provide proof of current Nurse's Practising Certificate• Maintain Registered Nurse compulsory professional development hours, appropriate to school nursing.• Attend School Nurse study days, cluster meetings and other events arranged by Te Whatu Ora, as time permits.• Ensure that the practice completed in the Health Centre is up to date and culturally appropriate for Tuakau College.• Run professional development programme for the staff around changes in first aid practices etc or find an appropriate provider to run these programmes. Programmes like: CPR, administering epi-pen, etc.
