A warm welcome back to Term 3! I hope that as a family you all had a relaxing holiday and that the weather did not stop your plans from doing something different. Having whanau time is so important for you and your child.

For us at school this term is an important term because it is a term of hard work to ensure the students achieve their academic goals by the end of the year. For Year 11, 12 and 13 students it is time to plan for success in their NCEA examinations and for the Junior and Middle College students it is about achieving to ensure they get their Diploma with the endorsement they deserve. We have been very lucky so far with COVID-19 and the flu, not having us roster home students too often. A frightening fact is that our Senior students only have 13 school weeks left before they head off to their examinations.

Attendance is a key aspect of achievement. There is a strong correlation between attendance and achievement. Low attendance indicates low achievement. Please ensure that your child attends school as much as possible.

School reports were issued on Thursday 28 July. During Week 3 of this term we have Parent Teacher interviews. (More information about this can be found on Page INSERT). I encourage all parents and caregivers to attend these interviews to collaborate with the teachers, to give your student assistance with improving in the subject. Staff really enjoy these evenings because it enables them to work with you, to discuss your child's progress and to put together a plan for improvement.

#### 'THE PRINCIPAL SPEAKS' CONTINUED...

The school value this term is 'perseverance' and I have asked the students to focus on ensuring they do not give up and continue to apply themselves to their studies when times get tough, and we are under no illusion that times have been tough for some of our families. At assembly on Monday I reminded the students that there are many people within the school that can help them and support them through tough times. Apart from their whānau, there are whānau teachers, subject teachers, Deans, their peers and friends that can all assist them. They need to communicate that they are finding things tough and that they want support. Many of our students are excellent at supporting each other when they have too.

The Administration Block is finally finished and opened for use! The Senior Leadership Team, Accounts, Payroll, Health Centre and Property can be found in this area. The Student Centre and Deans remain located at the end of B-Block as you enter the Elizabeth Street entrance. All student enquiries should be directed here. We are still finding our feet in the new spaces and it will take some weeks before we are fully functional.

Matariki (celebrating Māori student achievement) was held on July 7, 2022 at Ngā Tai E Rua marae and was a very successful evening. Congratulations to all the winners, especially Awhinatia Ngataki who won the Supreme Award. A function like this cannot be as successful without support from the school community and the organisers - Whaea Joidene and LeeAnne.

COVID-19 is going to be with us for sometime now. Thank you for supporting the drive to keep our tamariki safe by getting your students to wear masks and to continue to follow the health guidelines around washing hands, hand sanitiser use, not sharing food, etc. It has been a good start to the term.

At assembly I also reiterated what our standards are around vaping at school and the use of bad language. All the students were warned about the possible consequences.

The triennial Board Elections are coming up in September. Have you considered going onto the Board? The Tuakau College Board meets monthly (last Tuesday of each month). There are three committees that meet regularly as well: 'Finance,' 'Property' and 'Policy.' Other committees meet when they are needed, like 'Personnel.' We have two Teacher Only Days this term. The first one is on Friday 19 August where the staff will be completing professional development around Positive Behaviour for Learning and de-escalation techniques. The second Teacher Only Day is on Monday 22 August, where the staff will continue to plan for the implementation of the NCEA Level 1 changes as well as the new Literacy and Numeracy standards. I really appreciate you as a community supporting these days by keeping your kids at home because having the ability to work uninterrupted and to plan only leads to better achievement by our students.
