Kia ora koutou katoa!

We are at the end of May and halfway through the second term already! Time flies when you're having fun! Winter is upon us and I know that this means lots of rainy days and unpredictable weather. Along with winter come the ills and chills. Please, if your child is sick make sure you keep them at home otherwise they will only turn up to school to be sent home again by the school Nurse.

We ask that students continue to wear the appropriate uniform. Sweatshirts, beanies, etc are not Tuakau College uniform and we insist that students do not wear these. We do understand that some days will get very cool and request that parents and caregivers purchase the right uniform, to ensure the students are wearing the correct uniform. ## Koorero a te Tumuaki Haere tonu. . . The Principal speaks continued. . .

I would like to give a special shout out to all of our students that abide by and respect the school rules. Rules are put in place for students safety and so everyone can enjoy school in a respectable environment. Sometimes rules aren't always fun to follow as children, and we understand that, but right through life there will be rules, even in the workplace/universities/tertiary education/etc. A massive thank you to all of our students that work together with us by abiding by the rules.

Unfortunately, we have experienced a lot of negative behaviour at our College over the last two terms, culminating in an increased number of stand-downs and suspensions. There has been a significant increase in the use of violence by students at our school. This is unprecedented and as a College we feel this is totally unacceptable and we will not tolerate the use of violence to deal with any issue. There is no reason for students to use violence and as a College we are trying to understand why it is being used and what other measures we can put in place to ensure student safety is paramount.

The reasons for this spike in violence can be put down to a number of issues that the school community is facing. As part of this we are working closely with the NZ Police and whānau to put in steps to arrest the trend of what is happening. Many say it is the 'hangover' from the COVID-19 lockdowns, where students were isolated for long periods of time. Others are saying that it is because we have banned mobile phone use, which means the students now have to socialise more and they don't know how to. I believe it is the ongoing issues that our students are having with the continual exposure to social media, where students and others are putting up negative pages about students and the things they are saying and doing. Bullying, name calling, explicit photos, videos of arguments and fights, encouragement to commit offences, etc are just some of these sorts of social media posts. When they are exposed to this they think it is their right to deal with it by using violence.

When students are exposed to these posts and/or hear what others are saying about them, it is understandable that they will get angry, wild and frustrated and want to deal with the person but we have always encouraged them to talk to someone about it first. It could be a teacher, their parents, a friend, their peers, the Guidance Counsellor or someone that can help them so they do not have to use violence. If teachers know then we can act and do something about it before it gets to the violence stage.

At the end of the day there are no excuses for the use of violence. In many cases there are always extenuating circumstances but using violence is totally unacceptable. A number of times this has been reiterated to the students. Messages are easily forgotten by our students as they are bombarded by their peers and their social media accounts to use violence and as a school we would like your support in getting the messages across to your son or daughter.

On a positive note, we have a number of events happening in the next month, culminating in the Māori New Year and the celebration of this with the public holiday on Friday 24 June. I look forward to seeing the achievements of our students over the remainder of this term! Mr Chris Betty

## Changes to NCEA - Level 1, 2024 Nga Huringa ki NCEA - Taumata 1, 2024

As you may be aware, the government have decided to make changes to NCEA. These start with the Level One Students in 2024 (our current Year 10's).

#### What are the big changes?

- The aim is to have less assessment and more learning. Therefore, subjects will have four assessments across the year worth a total of 20 credits per subject.
- Students will need to pass both the Literacy and Numeracy co requisite (or equivalent assessments) in order to pass Level One. The co requisite is an exam that can be completed in June or November and can also be done prior to Year 11.
- Students will need to gain 60 credits (plus the Literacy & Numeracy) to pass NCEA Level One.
- Some new subjects will be offered and there is more of a NZ focus on the content of the learning and assessment.

In June 2023 a select number of Year 10 students are sitting the Literacy/Numeracy co requisite. Parents and students have been advised of this. We will then have another group sit this later in November.

If your child is sitting the upcoming exams, check out the below information:

It is highly recommended that students spend some time familiarizing themselves with the assessment platform and practice logging in to NZQA.

You can support this at home by asking your child (if they are completing the assessment in June) to complete the following steps:

- Go to <a href="https://www2.nzqa.govt.nz/">https://www2.nzqa.govt.nz/</a>
- On the top right hand side of the page, there is the login option. Select 'learners' and then login with either their school email or username and password that they recently created.
- When they have logged in, there is a menu on the left hand side of the screen.
- The 5th option down is 'find past digital exams.' Select this option.
- You then have the option to select what type of exam and what level they would like to access.
- Year 10 students should practice the Literacy Reading, Literacy Writing and/or Numeracy assessments.
- Click on 'Enter Sample Exam' and then enter the code 0000 when prompted.
- Student can then work through the sample questions and learn how to use the tools available to answer each question and submit the task. Please note that progress will not be saved and these sample assessments are not marked.
